
The Purpose of an IEP

An Individualized Education Plan (IEP) is a tool that ensures student access to the general education curriculum.

The IEP provides a synopsis of the student and what supports and opportunities will be provided to the student for success in school, which include:



- Present Levels of Educational Performance (PLEPs)
- Goals that focus on areas of concern
- Programs and related services
- Accommodations and modifications for classroom instruction and assessments
- Secondary post-transition


