

The SCSD welcomes all of our new and returning students! Here's a look back at the first day of school, 2023!


































#### NATIONAL MERIT SEMIFINALISTS!


What do you get when you add a team of math stars with a desire to help others? An award winning math society!



Brian also has coached boys basketball, middle school football and golf in the Harborfields Central School District. Welcome!


















Congratulations to the varsity sports teams at High School East and High School West on being recognized for their prowess in the classroom.
