**I. OPENING CEREMONY** - conducted by Mr. Alcure.

**II. COMMUNICATIONS**

**A. Correspondence** – There was no correspondence.

**B. General Communications** – There were no general communications presented for the Board's review.

**III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS-**

Gap Elimination Adjustment: Ms. Plourde asked if there were any updates on this legislative issue. Mr. Tobin responded that there has been no further developments as of now.

**IV. COMMITTEE REPORTS –**

**Business Affairs**: Mr. Morton reported that a committee meeting was held last week to discuss the School Lunch Program. A recommendation to increase the sales price for lunches came forth and is on tonight's agenda for approval. Mr. Liguori requested that the board receive monthly progress reports from the School Lunch program.

**Audit Committee**: Mrs. Knox reported that the committee met on July 7<sup>th</sup> with Don Hoffman of Cullen and Danowski the internal auditors. The Risk Assessment Update was presented and reviewed by the committee. The committee recommends the acceptance of the report, there was no corrective action necessary for that report. The committee and Mr. Tobin recommended that an AUP audit be conducted on the Special Education Department due to the amount of money that runs through that department as well as numerous personnel changes since the last audit. Mrs. Knox requested that a copy of Ms. Dunne's School Lunch Program plan be forwarded to the Audit committee since that was a subject of the prior audit. Mrs. Knox and Mr. Novak also proposed some changes to language of the Audit committee charter regarding the position of audit committee members and the role of the Audit committee. A document will be prepared for review by the attorneys reflecting those proposed changes. Mr. Tobin advised the committee that the district would have to borrow TANs money in October. The next committee meeting will be in October.

**NYSSBA**- Mr. Alcure reminded the Board of the NYSSBA annual convention to be held in New York City, October 26-28, 2014.

- Dr. Grossane has been touring the summer programs at Great Hollow and Smithtown Elementary. The programs have been very successful. Open houses for both programs will be held on Thursday.
- High School East science lab construction is on schedule and should be ready for the opening of school.
- The Housing committee co-chairpersons have met and set a tentative schedule of dates.

The district received additional funds through the Title 1 grant as well as some additional bullet aid from Senator Flanagan to help fund this coach.
