SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Updates – The Superintendent brought the Board up-to-date on the following items of interest:

- The Nesaquake Middle School Cabaret Singers will entertain the Smithtown Chamber of Commerce during their annual Christmas luncheon on December 8.
- The Peer Educators' Club at High School West is sponsoring an HIV Tree of Hope. They are requesting gift cards, which will be sent to HIV Victims.
- High School East's Media Art Honor Society and teacher Tim Needles will be working with *Big Brothers Big Sisters of Long Island* on a short film.
- The National Junior Honor Society at Great Hollow Middle School held a Thanksgiving Dinner as a fundraiser for local charities.
- Great Hollow Student Alex Barnes was selected to participate in the Institute of Creative Problem Solving for Gifted and Talented Students at SUNY College at Old Westbury.
- Accomsett Middle School will stress the theme of kindness through integrated classroom activities during the third annual "Cool to Be Kind" week. The goal of the week is to create an atmosphere of acceptance and tolerance by promoting a feeling of community in the school. Guest speakers include former New York Jet linebacker Marty Lyons.
- Each building throughout the District is participating in the *Toys for Tots* drive for Schneider Children's Hospital.
- Nesaquake Middle School Drama Club will present LOCKERS II, scenes from life in middle school, on Friday, December 1st at 7:30 pm.
- The Smithtown School of Business will be holding its 11th Annual Business Olympics on December 6. This year's theme is **Spotlight on Giving**.
- Ed Ehmann was honored as Administrator of the year by the Western Suffolk BOCES School Library System's Annual Conference. He had been nominated for all of his help in opening the Library at HS East.
- Mills Pond hosted a program called "**Escape School**" for parents and children, a child abduction prevention program that has been featured on national television.
- A committee has been formed at St. James Elementary to research and record the historical significance of the school. The goal is to share memorabilia, artifacts and memories of alumni and community members.
- Junior Troop 1182 and the Dogwood Peanut Butter Gang (community service group) held a coat drive in October. Many warm, beautiful coats were collected for needy families.
- WS BOCES has a bond initiative for a capital project to replace the modular/portable complex at a cost of \$5.475 million. BOCES has \$2.235 million on hand, leaving the balance of \$3.24 million to be borne by the 18 school districts. Smithtown's fee for one year is \$121,824 for a total of three years being \$365,472. The referendum on this will be held December 14th from 2 to 8 pm at the JEA Elementary School. Any citizen in the component districts may vote on this referendum.

INSTRUCTIONAL REPORT

Parent Portal & District Website

Mrs. Cahill announced that there would be a presentation this evening regarding the District Website and the Parent Portal. Mr. John Nolan and Mr. Daniel Fandrey have done exceptional work in the area of information technology, student computer use and have provided this District with resources that are outstanding.

Mr. Nolan advised that the Technology Department's goals have been to: replace seven and eight year old classroom computers through BOCES; upgrade elementary school computer lab to allow one computer per student; upgrade PowerSchool to meet needs of NY State data reporting and to implement PowerSchool Parent Portal website pilot program at the secondary level. The Parent Portal provides ability for parents to see attendance, report card grades, scheduling and daily bulletins online. The portal is available at the high school level now and will be available at the middle school level in January. Fifty percent of high school parents have already logged in and twenty percent of those parents have signed up for automated email. The system gives teachers and parents the ability to email each other. Dan Fandrey took over the Webmaster piece at the end of August and has redesigned the website. Over the past two months Mr. Fandrey has been both maintaining the current website and designing a new website. The new website gives us the ability to improve communications between parents and schools. Mr. Fandrey took the BOE and visitors through a tour of the many useful tools on the new website. It was noted that the new website will reduce future mailing costs and had been done with no additional hardware or software expense.

Mr. Gianino stated that he is very impressed with the revised website for the District. He asked if this website would allow for live streaming of BOE meetings. Mr. Nolan responded that there are limits and the District is stepping into it slowly so that the server will not go down. Mr. Gianino stated that if live streaming is not feasible at this time, might it be possible to tape the meetings and make them available that way. Mr. Nolan responded that it is something that will be looked into.

Mrs. Gerien, on behalf of the Board of Education, thanked Mr. Nolan and Mr. Fandrey for their work on the Parent Portal and the Website and also for their very informative presentation.
