OPENING CEREMONY - conducted by Mr. Raustiala. On motion by Mr. Gianino, seconded by Mr. Rossi, the Board voted unanimously to convene in Executive Session to discuss Particular Personnel and Litigation.

At 8:10 p.m. Mrs. Waldron moved, Mr. Schroeder seconded, and the Board reconvened the Special Meeting.

Ms. Wild, Mills Pond Principal, welcomed the Board and audience to the meeting and announced that there would be a presentation done by some kindergarten and first grade students. The Board enjoyed listening to original stories read by enthusiastic kindergarten and first graders. The students' teachers praised their students, the new reading/writing program and full-day kindergarten.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Presentation – The Superintendent indicated that she was pleased to be able to present a video of Smithtown East sophomore, James Brierton, giving a weather report on CNN. James explained how he had submitted his report to CNN and their positive reaction to it. All in attendance were quite impressed with James' accomplishment.

At 8:51 p.m. Mr. Saggese left the meeting.

The Superintendent stated that she wanted to acknowledge somebody in the audience, Phyllis Lader. Phyllis has served this community for many years; she has attended Board Meetings religiously and her column "Sooner or Lader" is well read. Phyllis is a reporter for the *Smithtown News* and is retiring; this is the last time that she will be officially sitting in our audience as a reporter. Both the Board of Education and central office administrators would like to acknowledge and thank Phyllis for her community service and we offer our very best wishes to her for a healthy and happy retirement.

Updates – The Superintendent brought the Board up-to-date on the following items of interest:

- The District hosted a successful conference day for more than 800 teachers, staff and administrators on March 26th at SHS East. The conference theme was "Integrating Technology in Education," and featured keynote speaker Alan November, an internationally recognized technology education leader. In addition, Smithtown teachers and staff facilitated technology workshops. Other teachers were engaged in scoring the mathematics assessments.
- St. James Elementary School Teachers Marianne Marquart, Elizabeth Waldvogel, Sara Long, and Diane Widmer are winners of a Western Suffolk BOCES Model Schools Teacher Integration Award. They are being recognized for their efforts in applying technology to classroom instruction. They have been invited to share their expertise with other teachers to help benefit student achievement.
- John Botte and Caitlyn Witkowski were winners for best overall project in the LIPA Clean Energy Challenge: helping to design the new green Nassau Coliseum. The students met Charles Wang, and will meet with him again to discuss their ideas in greater detail.
- The Board of Education will hold a Business Affairs Committee Meeting on Thursday, March 29th at 7:00 pm at the Joseph M. Barton Administration Building. The agenda will be a response to the Citizens' Budget Development Advisory Committee and the 2007-2008 Budget will be presented.
- Four Smithtown students were recognized at the Long Island Science and Engineering Fair. Kristin Hall was named as a first place finalist in Medicine, and she will advance to the Intel International Science & Engineering Fair in Albuquerque, NM, in May. In addition, Steven Benay was awarded second place in Biochemistry, Justin Schumacher took third place in Microbiology and Victoria Hung received an Honorable Mention for her work in Physics.
- John Nolan, Network and Systems Coordinator, and Manny Camacho, Print Shop Supervisor, were presented awards at SCOPE's Sixth Annual School District Awards Forum on March 22 at the Melville Marriott.
- Math Honor Society students from both High Schools recently hosted "Math Madness" in the High School West Library. More than 300 middle school students and many parents attended the event, which was organized to demonstrate the far reaching uses of mathematics in our world. By

presenting mathematics to middle school students through recreational hands-on activities, the goal was to foster in the students a greater appreciation for mathematics as they continue their studies.

- The School of Business Lifesmarts team placed third in the New York State Competition. The five students representing both East and West were: Stephen Wirth, Chris-Anthony Scaturro, Brendan Connell, Brian Read and Matthew Rodriguez.
- Three High School West students received Honorable Mention at the American Association of Teachers of Italian Poetry Contest at Stony Brook University. They are: Jessica Noviello and Hojun Lee, Level I, and Daniela Vernice, Level II.
- The District, in conjunction with SCOPE, will be offering the Summer Explorations Program again this year. It will be held from July 9 to August 3 and brochures will be sent home from school with the children during April. The brochure will also be available on the District website.
- The District will be participating with Suffolk County Executive Steve Levy's office in an effort to help combat hunger in Suffolk County. Long Island Cares has supplied collection bins to collect non-perishable canned and boxed foods, which will be donated to a number of food pantries throughout Long Island.
- Great Hollow Middle School recently presented a performance of the musical comedy "Me and My Girl" to invited local senior citizen groups. Pizza and refreshments were provided at intermission.
- Eight Accomsett Middle School students came in first place at the United Cerebral Palsy "Trivia Challenge" held on March 14th in Commack. Gregory Mayer, Christopher McIlwaine, Richard O'Leary, Mark Valentino, Jesse Lyons, Robert Valentine, Thomas Focone and Newell Craft competed with thirty Suffolk County teams.

Superintendent's Proposed Budget

This Thursday there will be a meeting of the Business Affairs Committee where the Board will respond to the CBDAC's recommendations.
