**V. UNFINISHED BUSINESS** – None.

**VI. COMMITTEE REPORTS** -

Athletic Council- Mr. Thode reported that he and Mrs. Waldron attended the Athletic Council meeting held on January 30th. Mr. Thode commended Mr. Smith, administration and the students for doing an excellent job. Currently 51% of students participate in athletics and have participated in 33 community service events. The Booster club has financed numerous projects including basketball backboards, tshirts, Hall of Fame dinner and scholarships to name a few. In addition Smithtown has 31 seniors going on to play a sports at a Division 1 college or university.

Mrs. Waldron reported that prior to the Athletic council there was the annual HIV/AIDS curriculum meeting. The Athletic Council meeting also mentioned that Dan Claxton, High School East senior, holds the national record for high jump at 7 feet. There are 4,406 athletes participating in sports, with every varsity West high school team and all but one team at HSE qualifying for the Scholar Athlete Team award. There is an AED machine on all the secondary fields, weight rooms at the high schools need upgrading to meet criteria and demands to comply with wellness criteria.

Mrs. Plourde had some additional announcements; our combined East and West Hockey club who recently beat Ward Melville is going on to state competition, the West wrestling team won their league tournament and has 3 all county winners, and East wrestling took fourth in league competition.

SEPTA – Ms. Plourde reported that last night a meeting was held as a follow up to the November meeting which introduced parents to different technics in addressing Executive Functioning disorders.

Business affairs- The first Budget workshop was held on February 7<sup>th</sup>. The workshop included a review of budget history including the tax cap implications, TRS and ERS contributions, economies of scale etc. The district is on target to have a balanced budget without significant cuts. The other topics covered included non- instructional budget items such as technology and transportation. The next Budget workshop is March 7<sup>th</sup>.

**VII. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT**

**A. Updates**- Dr. Grossane updated the Board on the following points of interests.

- Dr. Grossane attended the Robotics First Tech Challenge at High School West. Over 200 students from schools all over Suffolk County were participating.
- **Statemenet on the Sale of New York Avenue.**

As many of you are aware, the district entered into a contract of sale with the Southern Land Corporation for the NYA property in October of 2016. As we have stated numerous times, the proposed use of the property for multi-family housing was originally suggested and encouraged by the Town of Smithtown as part of the revitalization efforts for the downtown area. The need for variances was understood, and the Town was clear on its intent to support such a project. After the meeting SLC held in December, and in view of the public comments, SLC requested to extend their due diligence period to further consider their options. Had the district not agreed to that request, SLC's other opportunity for withdrawal from the contract without

penalty would have been if the needed variances were denied. That would have been a much longer period than 30 days. During the extension period, as was permissible under the terms of the contract, SLC reconsidered their position and withdrew from the contract without penalty, as was their right.

Last school year, the Board of Education was repeatedly asked by the community to sell the NYA property so the proceeds could be utilized to maintain our high quality educational programming. It was strongly felt that the relocation of central office to the Nesconset building and the sale of NYA would only benefit the district. The school board agreed to investigate this possibility, always keeping in mind that any sale would have to prove both economically viable and be beneficial to the taxpayers of the Smithtown Central School District, in a fiscally responsible way. With the SLC contract, after subtracting the costs of a relocation to Nesconset Elementary, the satisfaction of the remaining bonds on the NYA building and paying the realtor's commission, the district would have "netted" a substantial sum of money, perhaps as much as \$10M. Those funds could have been utilized to lower the tax levy, supplement future budget deficits, and/or have been used to fund much needed capital improvements in the 12 buildings that house our students. In fact, if the proceeds of the sale had been utilized for capital improvements in our instructional buildings, the district would be reimbursed by NYS at a rate of 58% in state building aid, meaning that for every dollar spent, the district would be refunded 58 cents. Those reimbursed dollars would represent yet another source of funding for the district. This capital work would have **NO COST TO ANY TAXPAYER IN THE SMITHTOWN CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT because the money came from the sale of real estate.** That was the plan. It was a good plan, and it still is a good plan for any proceeds which result from the sale of real property.

The Town of Smithtown has approached the Smithtown Central School District regarding the purchase of the NYA property. Representatives from administration, the school board and our attorneys met with Town officials yesterday. We explained at length that the reasoning behind the district's desire to sell the property was not simply to relocate our district offices, but rather to convert the asset into proceeds which would be a non-property tax funding source to benefit all of our taxpayers. We are pleased that the Town is interested in the property and look forward to hearing their proposal in the near future.

As we explained many times last year, real estate sales are complicated and take a long time. If the Town presents an offer to the school board, they will deliberate and determine whether the sale is on balance and taking all factors into account is beneficial to the taxpayers of the district. At this time, the district is in conversation with no entity other than the Town of Smithtown since all other proposals were based on a zone change that the Town now says is off the table. We have heard from members of the community about their desire to maintain the fields and even the NYA building and have also heard their request to be included in the process. If an acceptable arrangement cannot be reached with the Town of Smithtown, the school board will then determine if they wish to further pursue the sale of the property. The school board may also choose to take the property off the market for the foreseeable future.

Other than the \$125,000 utility charges per year, the district will continue to spend only what is absolutely necessary to maintain the NYA building and property as a safe, healthy workplace. The district will receive no state aid reimbursement for any work done at the NYA building or property, as it is not used for instructional purposes for school age children.
