Objective:


- Transition students from middle school to AP level work in one year

 - Preview more than review








Sample Writing Prompts






Elementary Update

Areas for Future Growth

- 1. Enhancing the full scope of elementary instruction using Book Creator
- 2. Improving data-driven instruction at the secondary level using DataMate Assessment Analysis System. Currently, DataMate is being used in a pilot form in a few of our classes
