PARTNERING WITH NORTHWELL

During the 2021-2022 school year, the Smithtown Central School District worked with Northwell Health and other districts to support the creation of a Behavioral Health Center designed to assist students and families with mental health resources and support.

The Northwell Health Behavioral

Health Center, located at 2171 Jericho Turnpike, Suite 345, Commack, has been operational since Sept. 1 to support our students and families. Services include assisting students and families in crisis with emergency mental health assessments, referrals, coordination of care and transitional care. Smithtown Central School District students (with parental

consent) can access these resources if needed. It is important to note that these services are confidential and voluntary. Prior parental consent is required before information will be shared with others. Northwell Health will also provide community education for families by offering various tips and strategies on topics to support their children. When students have the support and resources they need, they drastically increase their ability to successfully

navigate the school and the community.

Our partnership with Northwell Health supplements the existing support provided by the Smithtown Central School District. Our students have access to school psychologists, school social workers and school counselors in each of our schools. The district provides school-based counseling, assists families with early detection of possible mental health challenges and supports families with community treatment options. With parental permission, we partner with outside therapists and agencies to provide a comprehensive and unified approach to supporting students and their families.
