Accompsett Elementary School students laced up and raised \$1,538.43 for the nonprofit Solving Kids' Cancer.






Student-athletes at Great Hollow Middle School raised over \$2,000 for the nonprofit Corey's Promise, which raises awareness for childhood cancer.
