

TEAM 810 MAKING MAJOR IMPACT


The Smithtown Robotics Team has been making a major impact locally, nationally, and even internationally!


Congratulations to our new Miss Long Island Teen 2026, Shyla Silva!





ALL-STATE!




Congratulations to High School East's Branden Jurlando for being named to the New York All-State Team!
