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#### **HOLOCAUST EDUCATION AT HSW AND HSE**


Smithtown High School East and West students recently received wise advice during a visit from Dr. Bernie Furshpan, the son of two Holocaust survivors.

"There's always hatred but let's stop this nonsense," Dr. Furshpan told the students. "Let's grow as a society."










#### **PRINCIPLES OF ENGINEERING**


Students in Mr. Savage's PLTW Principles of Engineering class at High School East were tasked to design, build, and program a robot that mimics an animal's behavior or characteristics.

The designs included an owl tracking its prey, coyote's jaws and neck movement but only at "night" and a hawk's ability to keep its head straight while its body moves.

Biomimicry engineering is the practice of creating designs based on structures and sequences from the Earth's natural world, including its plants, animals, and geographies. Many industries benefit from the principles of biomimicry engineering, including architecture, automotive, healthcare, and conservation.

Ninety students from Smithtown East and West DECA competed in the New York DECA State Competition this year in Rochester, New York.



The Relay For Life team came up the idea of a student versus faculty basketball game, and together more than \$700 was raised and will be donated to the American Cancer Society.




















### **SUPER AT STATES!!!**
