Congratulations to High School East senior, Jolene Cao, who recently was honored as a Regeneron finalist in Washington D.C.! Jolene was one of six Long Island high school seniors and 40 nationwide, to be named finalists in the country's most prestigious science research competition.

Cao's research project was titled, "Synthesis of Stable and Magnetically Responsive Magnetite/Cesium Lead Halide Perovskite Quantum Dots for Programmable Light Polarization."

Cao investigated perovskite quantum dots, tiny crystals at the quantum level used in the fields of energy, healthcare, and computers, that suffer from instability.


HISTORY MAKERS AT MIP
