Students achieving a weighted GPA of 4.4 and above are candidates for the Gold Cord with Distinction Honor. "College" and "PLTW" courses are eligible for Dual Enrollment credit.

SCHEDULING

- The Scheduling process for the next school year begins as early as December of the present school year.
- Counselors will advise students on how to begin inputting course requests. Students discuss and plan their course selection at home first. Counselors will then meet with each student to discuss and input selections.
- We encourage parents to read the [Program Guide](#) and ask any questions about the course selection process during this time. *An updated version will be available at a later date
- There will be time to review, discuss and make alterations to selections, and then you will be asked to review the final receipt of course selections before the system locks
- Once courses selections are reviewed, there will be no changes permitted to elective requests or P.E. (See the [Course Change Policy](#)).

- Opportunities begin at local organizations such as hospitals, religious affiliations, Big Brothers/Big Sisters, town hall, nursing homes.
- Begin commitment in 9th grade and stay with the organization for 4 years. Each year, take on new responsibilities within the organization to show growth and leadership skills.
- Devote volunteer time to one or two organizations rather than multiple organizations. It's the “quality” of work, not “quantity.”
- Keep a list of all extracurricular/volunteer activities beginning in grade 9.

NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

11th grade students who meet the criteria will be invited to apply (this typically takes place in the month of January).

PLAN AHEAD – COLLEGE TESTING

- AP exams are scheduled in May
- PSAT is taken in October of junior and/or sophomore year
- SAT Reasoning Test and ACT are typically taken in the spring semester of the junior year
- Retake SAT/ACT, if necessary.

COLLEGE TESTING: STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES (CLASSIFIED, DECLASSIFIED AND 504 STUDENTS:)

- Students who are approved for IEPs or 504 Plans in school do not automatically receive accommodations on College Board (SAT, PSAT, AP) or ACT tests. Requests must be reviewed and approved by College Board and ACT prior to the test dates. **Accommodations are not guaranteed and are not immediate.**
 - The review process can take up to 7 weeks so it is important to be aware of the submission deadlines which can be found on their website.
 - By submitting this [Google Form](#) you are allowing Smithtown Central School District to initiate a request for accommodation on your behalf. Additional documentation may be requested prior to submission.
 - ACT application is completed when the student registers for the ACT test in their junior year.
