



USING TEST SCORES IN THE ADMISSIONS PROCESS


Effective with applicants for the fall 2021 freshman class, the University of Oregon has become a "test-optional" school, allowing applicants for freshman admission the option to be considered for admission without submission of ACT or SAT scores.

Especially during a time of adjustments and test date cancellations due to COVID-19, we have also chosen to be "test-blind" for scholarship consideration. This means that even if you were to provide us with scores from a past sitting, it will not be considered in any merit- or need-based awards.

<u>Stamps</u>	3.85 GPA or higher on a 4.00 scale; academic and extracurricular	Yes	Apply for admission to UO by November 1. Stamps Scholarship application due November 15. All admission application materials must be received by the Office of Admissions by November 15.	
<u>Presidential</u>	3.85 GPA or higher on a 4.00 scale; academic and extracurricular	Yes	Apply for admission to UO by January 15. Presidential Scholarship application due February 1. All admission application materials must be received by the Office of Admissions by February 15.

How Should I Prepare?

High School Timeline

Sophomore Year:

- Take the preliminary Scholastic Aptitude test (PSAT). Taking the PSAT now is practice for the PSAT test in junior year which allows you to be considered for a National Merit Scholarship. Find out dates and more information through the school counseling office.
- Polish your study skills. Improve upon subject areas and identify areas of weakness in order to be proactive.
- Begin early research phase of college search process.

Junior Year:

- Take the preliminary Scholastic
 Aptitude test (PSAT). Ask your school counseling office about test dates for the PSAT, ACT and SAT. You'll need to register weeks ahead of time.
- Dive deeper into the college search process. Plan college visits, identify schools of interest, and consider attending programs of interest.
- Sign up for/Access ACT and SAT prep. Identify free or inexpensive resources available to you.
- Discuss Advanced Placement options, and adding rigor to your course load.


