ACADEMIC QUIZ BOWL

Membership/enrollment: Open to all students/anytime

The Academic Quiz Bowl club participates in Jeopardy!-style question-and-answer competitions, including the Long Island Regional Quiz Bowl tournament, and away tournaments. Among the club's achievements has been its participation in the National Academic Championship in Washington, D.C., fourteen of the last fifteen years.



ALTERNATIVE ARTS AND JAPANESE CULTURE



Membership/enrollment: Open to all students/ anytime

The Alternative Animation club is a place where you can learn about different styles of animation arts, practice creating your own, and meet with other students who share an interest in animation from across the globe.

ASL CLUB

Membership/enrollment: By invitation

The focus of the American Sign Language (ASL) Club is to enhance current ASL students' knowledge through personal interaction, games, and complete immersion into the culture. Students will help increase awareness about Deaf culture and their struggles around school and in the community. ASL Club meets twice a month for at least an hour to allow ample time for handling club business, developing ideas to spread awareness and enjoyable open communication.



ATHLETES HELPING ATHLETES

Membership/enrollment: Open to all students/ anytime

Athletes Helping Athletes trains high school student-athletes to conduct workshops for elementary and middle school students on issues ranging from self-esteem and sportsmanship to bullying & teasing and substance abuse. In these workshops, student leaders discuss making



proper decisions concerning high school parties and other social settings, and talk about the power and use of language in creating social status. The discussions are designed to be positive and proactive while raising awareness and providing options that would empower students to make right decisions.

Athletes Helping Athletes provides all the tools for student-athlete leaders', who work in teams, to adopt classes for the academic year. SALT training prepares the student-athlete leaders to engage and manage the classroom, conduct "ice-breaker" exercises and talk about *life-skills* gained through participation in extracurricular activities. Further, each student-athlete leader is trained to relate a personal story relevant to a workshop topic that emphasizes *life-skills* and "real life" choices and decisions.

BRASS ENSEMBLE

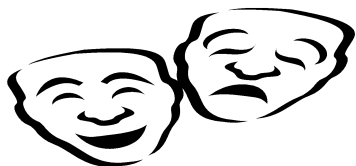
DECA

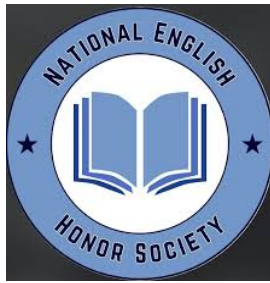
NATIONAL ART HONOR SOCIETY

NATIONAL ENGLISH HONOR SOCIETY



Membership/enrollment: By invitation based upon academic standing, then application

The mission of the National English Honor Society is to recognize the academic accomplishments of our students and promote their continuing interest in the English language arts. The society participates in activities designed to foster a love of the English language in all its forms and work within the community to encourage interest in its arts.

NATIONAL FRENCH HONOR SOCIETY

Membership/enrollment: Eleventh and Twelfth graders who have an average of 3.4 in French by the 11th grade or 3.0 in French in the 12th grade. Admission is by induction in the fall semester.

The aim of this organization is to stimulate interest in the study of the French language, to promote high standards of scholarship, to reward scholastic achievements, to create enthusiasm for and understanding of Francophone culture and civilization, to promote and maintain international friendship, and to reward efforts toward furthering solidarity in the French speaking world.



NATIONAL GERMAN HONOR SOCIETY



Membership/enrollment: By induction

The German Honor Society Delta Epsilon Phi is a program for high-achieving German students administered by the American Association of Teachers of German. Qualifying students are inducted at a ceremony in the fall of their junior year. Other activities include an international night, social events, fundraising, community service, and possible field trips.

NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

Membership/enrollment: Invitation based upon academic standing and Induction based upon satisfaction of the four pillars of Scholarship, Leadership, Service, and Character.

The mission of NHS is to "create enthusiasm for scholarship, to stimulate a desire to render service, to promote leadership, and to develop character in the students of secondary schools" (from the NHS Constitution). These purposes also translate into the criteria used for membership selection in each local chapter.

The Smithtown East National Honor Society promotes the four pillars through activities including peer tutoring at Homework Cafe and various local community service projects.

Membership/enrollment: By induction- in the fall

The purpose of SADD is to raise student and community awareness about the dangers of smoking, substance abuse, drinking and driving, as well as encourage alternative choices. SCHOOL OF BUSINESS/BUSINESS HONOR SOCIETY



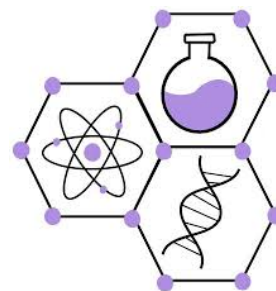
Membership/enrollment: Open to ALL students, this is a non traditional Honor Society, we will guide you and help you to be inducted into the NYS Business Honor Society.

Membership/enrollment: Open to all sophomore students

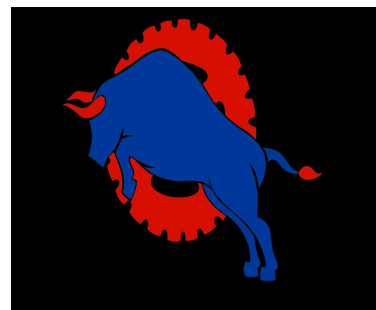

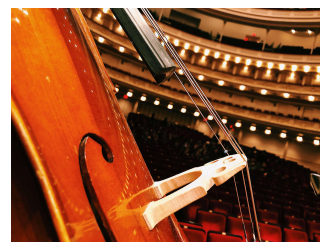
**STAGE TECH CLUB****Membership/enrollment:** Open to all students/anytime
