- 5. Faculty Committee convenes for final recommendations.
- 6. Students must attend scheduled rehearsals to participate in the induction ceremony (held in Spring details will be provided during monthly membership meetings.)
- 7. A formal Induction Ceremony will be in the Spring (2026.)

## **National Honor Society Selection Information**

### **MEMBERSHIP**

Selection of students for membership in the National Honor Society, one of the highest honors that can be awarded to a high school student, is based on scholarship, leadership, service and character. Membership is not based solely on academic eligibility. Membership is open to qualified juniors and seniors who have been in the school the equivalent of one semester. This period is necessary for students to establish themselves and for the faculty to get to know them.

### **ACADEMIC ELIGIBILITY**

Academic eligibility requires a minimum cumulative weighted grade point average of 3.75. Grades are not rounded up. Juniors must have earned a minimum of 10 credits; seniors must have earned a minimum of 15 credits.

#### **LEADERSHIP**

To fulfill the leadership requirement the candidate must have demonstrated some of the following and indicate specific examples on the attached form:

- Is resourceful in proposing new problems, applying principles, and making suggestions
- Demonstrates initiative in promoting school activities
- Exercises positive influence on peers in upholding school ideals
- Contributes ideas that improve the civic life of the school
- Is able to delegate responsibilities
- Exemplifies positive attitudes
- Inspires positive behavior in others
- Demonstrates academic initiative
- Successfully holds school offices or positions of responsibility; conducts business effectively and efficiently; demonstrates reliability and dependability
- Is a leader in the classroom, at work, and in other school or community activities
- Is thoroughly dependable in any responsibility accepted
- Is willing to uphold scholarship and maintain a loyal school attitude

### **SERVICE**

To fulfill the service requirement the candidate must have demonstrated some of the following and indicate specific examples on the attached form:

- Volunteers and provides dependable and well organized assistance, is gladly available, and is willing to sacrifice to offer assistance
- Works well with others and is willing to take on difficult or inconspicuous responsibilities
- Cheerfully and enthusiastically renders any requested service to the school
- Is willing to represent the class or school in inter-class and inter-scholastic competition
- Does committee and staff work without complaint
- Participates in some activity outside of school; for example, Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, church groups, volunteer services for the elderly, poor or disadvantaged
- Mentors people in the community or students at other schools
- Shows courtesy by assisting visitors, teachers and students

### **CHARACTER**

A person of character demonstrates the following six qualities: respect, responsibility, trustworthiness, fairness, caring, and citizenship. To fulfill the character requirement the candidate must have demonstrated some of the following:

- Takes criticism willingly and accepts recommendations graciously
- Consistently exemplifies desirable qualities of behavior (cheerfulness, friendliness, poise, stability)
- Upholds principles of morality and ethics
- Cooperates by complying with school regulations concerning property, programs, office, halls, etc.
- Demonstrates the highest standards of honesty and reliability
- Regularly shows courtesy, concern and respect for others
- Observes instructions and rules. Is punctual and faithful both inside and outside the classroom
- Has powers of concentration, self-discipline, and sustained attention as shown by perseverance and application to studies
- Manifests truthfulness in acknowledging obedience to rules, avoiding cheating in written work, and showing unwillingness to profit by the mistakes of others
- Actively helps rid the school of bad influences or environment

### Selection

Selection of students for membership is the responsibility of the Faculty Committee, a five-member board made up of volunteer staff members, as well as the National Honor Society advisors who serve as ex officio, non-voting members. Approval is based upon a majority vote by the committee. Selection will be based upon the information submitted by the student on the Student Information Packet as well as the recommendations from the committee and faculty. Students should understand that submission of this document does not automatically guarantee selection. Anyone submitting a Student Information Packet will be notified in writing of the Faculty Committee's decision regarding eligibility.
