<u>Unofficial Transcripts</u> - To access electronically, please log in to the Parent Portal using your username and password. Once logged in click on the "Document Portfolio" link on the left side of the screen. Click on the "Unofficial Transcripts" tab on the top of the screen. Finally, select the transcript on the left side of the screen. Please note that only parent/guardian accounts can access the Document Portfolio.

<u>Nominations</u> - If it is indicated that a scholarship requires a nomination by Smithtown High School, students must submit their names for consideration to the Counseling Center prior to the nomination date.

- Have not accepted scholarships exceeding the monetary value of \$16,000.
- Come to the Counseling Center for nomination consideration.
- Please submit your resume along with your nomination request.

<u>The Elks National Foundation Most Valuable Student Scholarship</u> Criteria: DEADLINE: November 12, 2025

- Applicant must be a U.S. citizen.
- Applications will be based on academics, leadership and financial need.
