Be sure to obtain all school provided documents in advance of scholarship deadline dates as some deadlines may occur during school closures.

Please be sure to check the bulletin each month for SHSE or SHSW specific scholarships. Access this bulletin online to print applications and link directly to websites. Applications can also be printed in the Counseling Center.

Unofficial Transcripts - To access electronically, please log in to the Parent Portal using your username and password. Once logged in click on the “Document Portfolio” link on the left side of the screen. Click on the “Unofficial Transcripts” tab on the top of the screen. Finally, select the transcript on the left side of the screen. Please note that only parent/guardian accounts can access the Document Portfolio.

Nominations - If it is indicated that a scholarship requires a nomination by Smithtown High School, students must submit their names for consideration to the Counseling Center prior to the nomination date.

Hagan Scholarship

DEADLINE: December 1, 2025

Criteria:

- Students can apply regardless of nationality or citizenship.
- Must have a 3.50 cumulative G.P.A.
- Must enroll in a four-year college or university the fall semester following high school graduation.
- If awarded a scholarship, must work 240 hours from January 1, 2026 until September 1, 2026.
- Parents 2024 Adjusted Gross Household Income must not have exceeded \$100,000.

DEADLINE: January 23, 2026

Criteria:

- At least one parent must be of Italian descent.
