OVERVIEW

In order for you to become more comfortable with potential topics of inquiry that could hold your interest for the year, it's best to reflect on the things you enjoy and take a quick glance at those topics to see how others have turned them into research studies. Hopefully through this gathering of ideas, when you enter AP Research in the fall, you will be able to make an informed decision about the different ways you could approach one (1) topic of inquiry that will guide your year-long Quest.

INTEREST & EXPLORATION INVENTORY

The goal of these questions is to help you brainstorm ideas for an anticipated AP Research project. For these sections, do a little reflecting on things you have wondered about, questioned, learned about in your classes and learned about in your day-to-day life.

Then, based upon your answer you will then conduct a basic search using GOOGLE SCHOLAR for research paper titles on the topic area. This will encourage you to begin to see how researchers created different types of research studies all based on a similar topic.

Opening and Saving Your File

Make sure you see the Drive logo in the upper left hand corner. It is now saved in your Kami Uploads Folder in your Google Drive

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
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Click on the top and rename it with your full name and the name of the assignment.

Click the T then click where you want the textbox to appear


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Once you click to create the textbox, you will see the text toolbar pop up on the top of your Kami screen.

You can also format your text after typing by highlighting the text and then selecting the font, point size, and spacing.




<u>Sharing / Submitting Your Work</u>
