OPENING CEREMONY - conducted by Mr. Gianino. On motion by Mrs. Waldron, seconded by Mr. Rossi, the Board voted unanimously to convene in Executive Session to discuss Particular Personnel, Negotiations and Litigation.

At 8:02 p.m. Mrs. Waldron moved, Mr. Saggese seconded and the Board reconvened the Regular Meeting.

MINUTES - of the Regular Meetings held September 11 and 25, 2007 were presented for approval.

Section B - General Communications – There were no general communications presented for the Board's review.

OLD BUSINESS

Overnight Field Trips

Mr. Rossi asked for an update on his previous inquiry regarding the number of chaperones needed for overnight field trips.

Ms. Cahill gave a summary of an analysis that had been done on the 2006-07 overnight field trips. She stated that the relationship between the number of students to chaperones was quite good but an additional chaperone should go with the children to maintain a ratio of around 1/10. After back-and-forth discussion it was agreed that Ms. Cahill would bring a proposed revision of the Superintendent's Uniform Practices regarding this issue to the next BOE meeting.

Branch Brook Septic System

Mrs. Waldron noted that at the Board's request the Superintendent had written to Suffolk County regarding the groundwater problems in the District. Mr. Joseph Williams, SC Commissioner, has responded in writing thanking the District for its input regarding this problem and the detailed listing of costs which both have been and are expected to be incurred by the District. Mr. Williams also advised the District that there will be public meetings in November to further discuss the issue.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Business Affairs

Mr. Saggese reported that a Business Affairs Committee Meeting had been held on October 1st in which the District presented a detailed analysis of capital accounts. The positive results were that there are unexpended funds available which can be used for capital improvement. Using an extensive list the District provided an overview of where the money is to be spent.

Mr. Ehmann then used a slide presentation outlining Phase 1 of the capital project. Mr. Ehmann announced that the tax rate is not the 5.09% that was estimated last spring, but is 4.79%.

Facilities

Mr. Rossi announced that there will be a Facilities Committee Meeting on October 24th at 7:00 p.m.

Housing

Mrs. Waldron announced that she and Mrs. Knox will be receiving a quick update from Mr. Ehmann and Dr. Ain on last year's Housing Committee information and Dr. Ain will then set a date for the next Housing Meeting.

Negotiations

Mr. Saggese noted that a tentative date of October 16th at 4:00 p.m. has been put forward.

Policy

Mr. Gianino noted that there had been discussion regarding changing the policy that states the first Board Meeting of the month is held at NY Avenue and the second meeting of the month will be held at alternate sites. At the next meeting there will be a proposed policy stating that both meetings will be held at NY Avenue.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Updates – The Superintendent brought the Board up-to-date on the following items of interest:

- Ashok Chandran, a High School East senior, was named a Semifinalist in the 2008 National Merit Scholarship Program. He scored in the top one percent of students throughout the country who took the 2006 PSAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test. Fourteen Smithtown High School students have been named Commended Students in the National Merit Program and have received Letters of Commendation. These students scored in the top five percent of students who took the test. They are Glenn Caulfield, Deborah Colantuoni, Weston Gardner, Harold Kang, Andrew Kerr, Diana Liu, Joseph McGrann, David Orama, Thomas Petracca, Tracy Schilling and Ryan Terbush of HS West and Alexander Gutman, Joshua Jund and Kayley McGrath of HS East.
- Alicia Chionchio and David Orama, HS West seniors, have been recognized by the College Board's National Hispanic Recognition Program. This program provides national recognition of the exceptional academic achievements of Hispanic high school seniors.
- Smithtown students recently participated in the Shanti Fund Peace Conference. The event was held in celebration of the birthday of the late Gandhi, the Indian leader and peace activist. Students represented their schools in various projects and activities promoting world peace. The HS took 1st place in the HS Debate Competition. Posters and murals have been displayed at the Dennison building in Hauppauge. The winner of the poster Contest was HS student Ian Grosskopf.
- Branch Brook fifth grader, Emily Durcan, won first place in the Princess Ronkonkoma Productions 5th Annual Poetry Contest. Her poem was about the Smithtown Bull. She will read her poem and receive her award at a local Barnes and Noble Bookstore.
- The 2007- 2008 budget process will be launched with the first meeting of the Citizens' Budget Development Advisory Committee (CBDAC) for this school year. The meeting will take place on Thursday, October 18, at 7 p.m. at the Joseph M. Barton Administration Building, and is open to the public. For further information about participating on the committee, contact Mary Cahill, Assistant Superintendent for Instruction and Administration.
- High School East and High School West will both hold their own annual Safe Halloween celebrations on Wednesday, October 31st from 3:30 to 6:30 pm. Elementary students grades K-5 are invited to wear their costumes and participate in fun activities. They are asked to bring three non-perishable food items to support the Thanksgiving Food Drive.
- All parents were mailed a letter detailing three calendar changes. The information is also on the District website. **School will not be in session for students on Election Day, November 6;** faculty will participate in a Superintendent's Conference Day. The ELA Scoring Day has been moved to February 5. School will be in session for students on January 30 and closed for students on February 5. The Math Scoring Day has been moved to March 28. School will be in session for students on March 25 and closed for students on March 28, 2008.
- Katherine Berner, a senior at HSW, was accepted and participated in the 2007 NYS Summer Young Writers' Institute.
- First and third grade students throughout the District recently participated in virtual field trips using Smart Board technology in the high school distance learning labs. Using the NASA Digital Learning Network, NASA Experts interacted with students as they learned about the Solar System and Space.
- Due to the cost of maintaining the Arthur House the District is considering having it demolished. The District is considering having a more park-like venue in its place.
- Mr. Goldman, Purchasing Agent, reviewed the bid process with the Board of Education.
